## Newark Free Library News

The Friends of the Newark Free Library established the John Wriston Writing Prize in grateful and affectionate recognition of his many services over the years. As editor of the FNFL News, his essays were read and savored by many readers.

This essay contest is open to high school juniors and seniors who currently attend one of the three Christina School District high schools or whose parents reside within the Christina School District borders. The winner will receive \$1000 at the Friends of the Newark Free Library Annual Meeting in 2009 and will read the winning essay aloud. The theme for this year's essay follows:

From toddler to teen you have had different needs and have been open to different offerings of libraries. With specific details drawn from your own experiences describe how well libraries and librarians have managed to keep pace with your growth and perhaps encouraged it. Then try to describe, practically and concretely, an ideal library, one you would like to find on your college campus. Base this last part on research (online or in person) of an actual college library.

The essay should be 1100 – 1500 words in length, and should be in double-spaced, typed format. Please observe all rules of grammar, spelling and punctuation in your writing.

The deadline for entries is Sunday, March 1, 2009. Mail your essay to the Friends of the Newark Free Library, 750 Library Ave., Newark, DE 19711, or hand-

deliver it to the Reference Desk at the library by the deadline.

Well, the first semester has now come to an end. The students and teachers are working hard to finish the second semester with huge success. Second marking period report cards are due to come home with students on Feb. 2. Please contact your student's counselor with any questions or concerns regarding your student's academic performance. You may also access grades and attendance online by going to <https://hac.doe.k12.de.us>. Please contact your student's counselor if you need a login id and password. Please keep in mind that summer school will not be offered in the Christina School District in the summer of 2009.

Below are the promotion guidelines for each grade. The promotion guidelines are as follows starting with the class of 2012.

To be considered a 10th grader, students must have completed: \* 1 credit of ELA \* 1 credit of Mathematics \* 1 credit of Science or Social Studies \* 3 other credits (electives or pathway) \* Total of 6 credits are required to move to 10th grade

To be considered an 11th grader, students must have completed: \* A total of 10 credits, 7 of those credits must be in core subjects To be considered a 12th grader, students must have completed: \* A total of 17 credits, 10 credits must be in core subjects \* Students must be able to be scheduled for 26 credits by the end of senior year in order to be considered a 12th grader

There are many important dates to be aware of during the second semester. School is closed on

Monday, February 16th for President's Day. DSTP will begin March 11th and ends on March 20th. It is very important that all students are present for testing. Please schedule any appointments after school hours. School is closed on Friday, March 27th for Professional Development. Spring break begins Friday, April 10th-17th. School will reopen on Monday, April 20th. AP testing is from May 4th-15th. AP Students have received an AP bulletin with all relevant information about the exams. The registration process will begin on Monday, February 10th and end on Friday, February 27th. Registration forms will be available through your student's AP teacher or Mrs. Halfen in the main office. The exam fee is \$86.00 for each exam. Please contact Penny Halfen with any questions at halfenp@christina.k12.de.us or ext. 14750.

Juniors should register for the SAT exam by going on-line at [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com).

The remaining dates are March 14, May 2, and June 6. It is important to register as early as possible if you want to be placed at NHS to take the SAT.

All students in the class of 2010 and beyond must complete 60 hours of community service in order to graduate. This is not a credit, but a requirement for graduation. A student may earn a credit for volunteer service by completing 90 hours of service, which must be approved by the state.

## From The Nurse's Office – Winter 2009

### Flu Season

*Influenza*, also called the flu, is a contagious disease that is caused by the influenza virus. The main way influenza is spread is from person to person in respiratory droplets of coughs and sneezes. The Flu is different from a cold. Symptoms usually come on suddenly and may include:

- Fever
- Headache
- Tiredness
- Dry cough
- Sore throat
- Nasal congestion
- Body aches

### Attention all parents/guardians

With the onset of the upcoming flu season, this is a reminder to all parents to please keep your students home for any of the following:

- Fever of 100 degree or more- (**A student must be temperature free for 24hrs before returning to school**).
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Conjunctivitis also known as “Pink eye”

Some people can be infected with the flu virus but have not symptoms. During this time, those persons can still spread the virus to others.

*Practice tips for preventing the Flu include:*

- Covering your mouth when coughing and sneezing
- Frequent hand washing with soap

and water, especially after coughing and sneezing.

- Avoiding close contact with individuals who are ill.
- Stay home if you are sick!

### *Who is considered “High Risk”?*

- All children aged 6-23months
- Adults age 65 years and older
- Persons age 2-64 years with underlying chronic medical conditions
- All women who will be pregnant during the influenza season
- Residents of nursing homes and long-term care facilities
- Health-care workers involved in direct patient care
- Out of home caregivers and household contacts of children less than 6 months old.

### *What you should do if you get the flu:*

- Rest
- Drink plenty of fluids
- Avoid using alcohol and tobacco
- Take medications to relieve the symptoms of flu

***Update on food information offered in the cafeteria:***  
***Many positive changes have been made to the cafeteria menu to increase healthy food choices and provide food with less fat and sugar content. Some of the changes are as follows:***

- Whole grain breads introduced

early 2005 to add fiber

- Removal of soda machines last year
- Snack foods cannot have more than 35% of calories from sugar or other sweeteners and no more than 8 Grams of fat per serving or have 35% or less of its total calories from fat.
- Beverages offered must be made with at least 50% up to and including 100% real fruit juice and that do not contain added sweeteners
- Foods are not fried
- Fresh fruits are offered daily

***There are exciting new changes in the middle and high schools cafeteria. They include:***

- A minimum of 6 available salad selections
- Poached Salmon and Salmon Caesar salad
- New packaged sandwiches
- More entrée offerings
- Oriental stir-fry
- Caribbean, Middle-Eastern and regional American Cuisines
- BBQ chicken with jalapeno baked beans
- Authentic Latin and Spanish offerings
- Signature stuffed baked potato

*Other changes include offering of flatbread pizza made to order with toppings such as chicken and fresh vegetables.*
